II. Background

The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, with State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh, UNDP and the Global Tiger Forum is implementing a GEF funded project: Strengthening conservation and resilience of globally significant wild cat landscapes through a focus on small cat and leopard conservation.

This project aims to strengthen conservation of globally-significant wild cat landscapes in northern, north-eastern and western India through a landscape conservation approach for wild cats that brings together species conservation programs, connects stakeholders and empowers communities, and operates across PAs, tiger corridors and buffer zones.

The project has four complementary components (i) Build the required enabling framework and institutional capacities, (ii) strengthen government management of wild cats and habitat, (iii) build community stewardship at landscape level (iv) enhance private sector partnerships, regional collaboration and knowledge transfer and learning supported by gender mainstreaming and monitoring and evaluation.

III. Duties and Responsibilities

Under the overall supervision of the National Project Manager, the Business Partnership Development Specialist will perform the following functions:

- Identify and consolidate list of businesses and private sector entities that are relevant to the creation of a Green Business Platform under the project, through a consultative process
- Coordinate and assist the project team towards establishing the National-level Green/Wildlife Business Platform for enhancing corporate sector engagement, especially on community-based wildlife conservation
- Build support for establishment of the national level green business platform and provide input to its design and operations.
- Work towards an advocacy programme to mobilize corporate partnerships and CSR funds for project related initiatives in each landscape based on relevant issues through a consultative process
- Initiate regional dialogues between Government, industry and conservation partners operating within the project landscapes to evolve sustainable partnerships through multi-sectoral engagement
- Work with multiple business confederations, industries, Government agencies, while finding synergies with ongoing Central and State Government schemes, especially on livelihood and community welfare
- Facilitate the identification of sustainable financing options to maintain community stewardship in the project landscape
- Develop the legal and financial framework for evolving a multi-partnership financial instrument to be managed by the Green-business platform based on existing best practices across the globe. The instrument must be as per the requirements of the MoEF&CC, Govt. of India, and the project.
- Facilitate the development of business partnerships and implementation of pilot initiatives on the identified areas of interest, supporting implementation of the landscape master plans and multi-sector engagement
- Coordinate with the corporate sector to support complementary engagement for communitybased conservation in small wild cat landscapes, including a species-specific support program (on the lines of existing programs for big cats such as tiger, cheetah, and snow leopard)
- Ensure outcome and delivery as per the project document and decisions of the NPSC
