II. Background:
The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, with State Governments of Arunachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh, UNDP, and the Global Tiger Forum is implementing a GEF-funded project: <i>Strengthening conservation and resilience of globally significant wild cat landscapes through a focus on small cat and leopard conservation</i>. This project will secure the conservation of landscapes in northern, northeastern, and western India through a landscape conservation approach for wild cats that brings together species conservation programs, connects stakeholders and empowers communities, and operates across PAs, tiger corridors, and buffer zones. The project has four complementary components (i) Build the required enabling framework and institutional capacities, (ii) strengthen government management of wild cats and habitat, (iii) build community stewardship at the landscape level (iv) enhance private sector partnerships, regional collaboration and knowledge transfer and learning supported by gender mainstreaming and monitoring and evaluation. The services of a Landscape Conservation Planner are sought at the above-mentioned duty stations to perform the tasks listed in Section III – Duties and Responsibilities

III. Duties and Responsibilities:

Under the overall supervision of the National and State Project Management Unit, the incumbent will hold the following responsibilities:

- Technical support to the SPMU in the strategic planning process for the project at landscape level, and ensure its implementation in accordance with the signed project document
- Facilitate District and State level consultations on landscape planning and the coordination and integration of conservation and rural development initiatives to reduce inter-sectoral conflicts
- Facilitate the integration of master plans with existing planning processes, including Tiger Conservation Plans and on-going government/partner initiatives, State and District-level development and land use planning processes, including Eco-Sensitive Zone management, wild cat habitat connectivity, and climate-smart land use considerations e.g.: State Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans
- Coordinate the proposed Task Force facilitated by experts on wild cats, and facilitate extensive stakeholder consultation at national and state levels to gather relevant information on wild cats to inform conservation assessment, distribution atlas and gap analysis
- Facilitate the development of a national strategy for small wild cat conservation, by learning from good practices from across diverse habitats and regions of India that will help to inform an integrated model for small wild cat conservation through this project.
- Provide technical advice, workshop facilitation on landscape planning for species recovery plans for selected small wild cat species for protocol and SOPs on small wild cat management, training inputs on landscape conservation planning for State and District agencies and workshop facilitation on landscape planning for the development guidelines on management of habitats for wild cat populations
- Ensure alignment of planned project activities and Work Plans of the states with the Project Results Framework with emphasis on targets
- Coordinate with stakeholders in the Landscape Level Advisory Committee and State Project Steering Committee; ensure day-to-day management, administration, and delivery targets for the project
- Ensure regular coordination and reporting with field teams, PMU, State Govt. agencies, and technical experts in the respective project landscapes
- Ensure effective collection of primary and secondary data required for landscape-level planning and assessment
- Facilitate the implementation of landscape conservation plans while ensuring synergies and co-financing with all the relevant line departments and agencies across the project landscapes
- Capture best practices and lessons learned and facilitate their documentation, dissemination, and replication/upscaling
- Any other tasks assigned by the State Forest Department
